#### Garden visit at Robyn Boyd's - Sue

On a very windy afternoon we descended into a calm haven of green, surrounded by trees and bushes. Two huge old feijoa trees drop a lot of small tasty fruit every year; so many, they are given away to neighbours. In a sunny alcove by the house grows a profusely flowering tamarillo tree with a beautiful red fruit. The house has a productive grapevine draped high all along the veranda. Raised garden beds were waiting to be filled alongside a lush herb 'bits and piece' garden. The raspberry row was long and the future harvest looked promising. Because the site is an old quarry that had been built on, the ground never gets dry and it is very sheltered, a big bonus in Dunedin.

Thank you Robyn, for giving us your time and the opportunity to see your unique garden.

## **Sowing and Planting in December:**

This is the time of year when you can save money by sowing seeds for your "winter greens". If you grow seeds in planting modules, they can be a good size to put in position as you clear away the peas and broad beans. Having these brassicas follow the legumes gives them a chance to benefit from the nitrogen the legumes will have added to the soil.

**Time to Sow:** Asian vegetables, carrot, kale, kohlrabi, lettuce, peas, radish, silverbeet and turnip.

Last Chance to Sow: Beans (butter, French or runner), beetroot, brocolli, cabbage, capsicum, NZ spinach and swedes.

**Time to Plant:** Asian vegetables, brocolli, brussels sprouts, cabbage, cauliflower, celery, celeriac, leek and silverbeet.

Last Chance to Plant: Capsicum, courgette, cucumber, pumpkin-marrow-squash and tomatoes.

Too Late For: Seeds or plants of corn, potatoes, rhubarb or yams.
