What to plant in February

Seeds in trays or some in the ground Beetroot, bok choy, brassicas, carrots, peas, radishes, silver beet, and turnips

Plants in the ground

All brassicas, celery, leeks, lettuces, silver beet and spinach.

Moon Planting:

January 27th and 28th planting roots
February 4th and 5th planting roots
February 12^{th-20th} above ground planting
February 26th and 27th planting roots
March 5th and 6th planting roots.
