## Planting by the Moon October 2015

Oct 8th and 9th — sow root crops

**10**<sup>th</sup> **to 15th-** dig and cultivate, don't sow or plant

**16th to25th –** sow and plant above ground crops

Oct 31st and 1st Nov — sow root crops

#### What to plant now.-

Seeds-- broad beans, brassica family eg cabbages, kohlrabi, broccoli and cauli as well as lettuces, and other salad plants such as mizuna, corn salad, and what others you want to plant. Onions, radishes, swedes and turnips, fennel, beetroot, carrots, parsnips, leeks, and salsify.

**Seedlings**—Brassicas again as above, celery, rhubarb, salsify, silverbeet, spinach, swedes and turnip's, fennel, and beetroot as well as some of the plants as above if you already have seedlings of them.

(Potatoes for Christmas) and start of the main crop as well as Jerusalem artichokes and yams and I am trying earth gems this year. Tomatoes, pumpkins, courgettes, peppers, chili's and more fragile plants I am potting up in bigger pots to get a bigger root ball but ... too cold yet outside and cover those new potato shoots if a frost is forecast.
