What to plant in March

Seeds in trays or some in the ground

Saint Patricks day is good for planting peas and brown onions to winter over, You could also put in autumn carrots, Coriander, spring onions and maybe white turnips if they are not already in. **Plants in the ground**

All brassicas, celery, lettuces, (winter varieties) silver beet, bok choi and spinach. Spring onions and beetroot .

Moon Planting

March 12^{th} to 20^{th} – above ground planting March 27^{th} and 28^{th} plus April 3^{rd} and 4^{th} are good times to sow root crops
