Visit to Margaret Scott's garden January. Garden Visit January Margaret has lawn mowing sussed! She has eliminated them!! Her elevated property has become a food farm boundary to boundary, featuring many herbs, vegetables, fruit trees, nut trees, vines, fruit bushes, two chook houses, and a hedgehog house for good measure! Approximately thirty members attended this very interesting visit where a variety of garden management systems were featured. Margaret has developed ways to minimize path weed maintenance, and had an excellent method for replanting brassicas in a plot that had already grown them. The tip is to paint the tops of small stakes and insert them in the spot where a brassica had been removed. This helps to avoid club root when replanting the same area. The brassicas growing beneath a fruit tree impressed because they were doing really well in spite of the shade. Another tip shared is to have a variety of small garden tools placed around the property enabling a small job to be attended to there and then, instead of the trek to the tool shed! We were all treated to a sumptuous afternoon tea featuring produce from Margaret's garden. A very successful informative and social visit. Thank you Margaret for your generosity hosting the club

#### **GARDEN TASKS FOR February 2017**

**Sow seeds of:** Beetroot, Carrots, Cauliflower, Cabbage, Celery, Kale, Kohlrabi, Leeks, Spinach, Silver Beet, and Coriander.

Sprouting Broccoli, Radishes, Lettuces, White turnips and purple topped turnips, Spring Onions, and Bok Choi

#### Plant seedlings of:

Lettuces, silver beet, spinach, and Spring onions. All brassica's; Broccoli, Brussels sprouts, Cabbages, Cauliflower, Kohl rabi, Kale also Celery, Spinach and Silver beet. I plant what I need depending on what has grown the last month. January brassicas are for Autumn and March planting for Spring.

#### Moon Planting February 2017

March 2nd to 9th –sow and plant above the ground 15th and 16th – root planting There only

seems to be root planting this month. *February the 1st to 9th* – sow above ground crops
